Major & Minor Triads

This '[My Guitar Lessons](#)' lesson will help to develop your student's understanding of triads as it requires them to figure out both Major and minor triads on the fretboard and fill out the Guitar TAB. Combining worksheets with guitar lesson plans is an effective way for you to teach.
